This Newsletter, distributed along with IWGIA DOCUMENT nr. 8: Stefano Varese: The Forest Indians in the Present Political Situation of Peru, (price for non-members US \$ 0.50), is intended only to inform you of the recent publication of a very important work: THE SITUATION OF THE INDIAN IN SOUTH AMERICA. This book is the report of a symposium held in January 1971 in Bridgetown, Barbados, organized by the Ethnology Department of the University of Berne, and sponsored by the Programme to Combat Racism and the Commission of the Churches on International Affairs, World Council of Churches.

Its 454 pages include 19 articles and 50 pages of demographic surveys, critical bibliographies and maps. As the list of articles printed below indicates, it is the most comprehensive documentation of the present situation of the non-Andean Indians published until now.
